Learning through play

In the Early Years at West Ham Church School, our children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Early Adopter schools curriculum. The government states that 'The early years foundation stage (EYFS) framework sets the standards of learning, development and care for children from birth to 5'.

The Adopter curriculum is the 'NEW' curriculum that will take over from the current EYFS Development Matters. Being an adopter school means that we are trialling the curriculum before it is rolled out nationally to schools in September 2021.

When planning we include as much 'continuous provision' (play based learning) as possible. We make sure that the seven areas of development are covered.

Our topic this term is Fairy Tales - Goldilocks

Communication and Language

Tell someone at home the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

Tell them what Goldilocks saw when she went into the house.

Why not try using different voices for different characters?

Physical Development

Mixing porridge in bowls - this can be done wet or dry.

The larger the bowl the more movement the child uses - this is good for their fine motor skills for writing

Understanding the World

Use a book or the internet to look at real bears.

Think about where they live and see what interesting facts you can find out.

Can you draw a picture of a bear? What did you find out?

Personal, Social, and Emotional <u>Development</u>

Stranger Danger - Should she have gone inside a strangers house?

Think about the morals of the Goldilocks story - listening to your adult

Talk to the children about dialing 999 if there is

Mathematics

an emergency

We are going to be looking at size by measuring and comparing the Three Bears.

Can you use the counters to measure something in your home? Can you put your teddy bears into size order? (From smallest to largest.)

Expressive Arts and Design

Using small squares of paper, make a collage of the three bears house. Draw a picture of the porridge, chairs and bed and you can add them to your picture.

Don't forget to act out your play, from your work pack!

Literacy

Using your story map, can you draw pictures of all of your characters? Label them to describe who they are and what they do in the story. Retell the story using your pictures as story prompts to help you remember the plot.
