Dear Parents and Carers,

I cannot express how much the team here looked forward to welcoming the children back into school last week. We missed them so much and it was wonderful to hear the chatter of children throughout the school again. Our value this half term is Hope which seems wholly appropriate as new shoots of green push their way through the cold frost. We are all hoping a corner has been turned as we look forward to the future.

We owe all our parents and carers a huge thank you for supporting us with remote learning during the third lockdown. We know it hasn't been easy for some, or even most of you, but you did so well and we are grateful. The children have been amazing and many have learnt how to be independent, resilient and self-disciplined. Many children produced high quality work both at home and in school and their thirst for learning is unabated.

Of course, we know they greatly missed their friends, but understandably some were a little nervous about returning to school again. Their teachers planned activities based around team building and wellbeing to facilitate a smooth transition back to school. Our focus on outdoor learning will continue particularly as the weather continues to improve.

By the time Friday arrived, no doubt you noticed the children were tired. We had a few tears and some falling outs between friends. This is perfectly normal and to be expected. They are finding their feet again and learning how to get along. We are working to support their social, emotional and personal development. We understand that there are some children who have been traumatised by the events of the last year and some may need support to integrate back into school.

Our message is always the same - **be kind, be safe, be responsible**. We will never tolerate verbal or physical aggression nor bullying. All our teachers use the Good to be Green behaviour management programme which has clear boundaries and expectations. The emphasis on being positive with rewards for good behaviour is paramount. Children are given clear warnings to help them make the right choices and as a last resort, sanctions for inappropriate behaviour. We will be patient and understanding and work with the children to resolve conflict should it occur. Pastoral care and behaviour management at WHCS has always been recognised as a strength of the school.

The children will be very tired and possibly emotional when coming home. Sometimes, they might need to let off steam after a day at school. Change is challenging and in a world where there is so much uncertainty and anxiety, it has been tough for all. Routines both at school and home are key. They give security and control. Children respond well to consistency and clear boundaries. At school we have high expectations and we are ambitious for all. However, we also recognise that a child needs to be ready to learn and their mental health is a priority for us. Your support is greatly appreciated.
