Focus activity: special celebrations

The children will reflect on what is special to them, and to their families, and share their ideas with their friends.

What do you celebrate at home?

Understanding the World

Focus activity: The Christmas Story

This week the children will be thinking about why Christians celebrate Christmas, and why the birth of Jesus is so special for Christians.

What do Christians celebrate at Christmas?

Physical Development

Focus activity: winter decoration

The children will continue to develop their pincer grasp by moulding salt dough to create a winter decoration.

Can you mould the dough using your pincer grasp?

Literacy

Focus activity: writing captions

The children will be applying their knowledge of "The Elves and the Shoemaker" story by thinking of, and writing, their own descriptive sentences.

Can you write a caption for the story?

Personal, Social, and Emotional **Development (PSED)**

Focus activity: celebrating differences

To conclude our topic, the children will be encouraged to think of ways they can be inclusive.

Mathematics

Focus activity: numbers to five

This week the children will be revisiting the numbers one to five in order to develop fluency and subitising skills.

Focus activity: working from a plan

This week the children have been using paint in spray bottles to make different patterns and mix colours. We will extend this next week to create our own wrapping paper.

Communication and Language

Focus activity: talking about the Christmas story

Using our nativity small world scene, we will talk about the people in the Christmas story and talk about what happened in this special story.

What did the Angel Gabriel tell Mary?

Understanding the World

Focus activity: discussing Christmas

During circle time we will talk about celebrating Christmas and what Christians do at this special time of year.

Can you remember how some people celebrate
Christmas?

Physical Development

Focus activity: dancing in time to music

This week in ballet we will use different movements to express how the music makes us feel.

Can you move your body quickly and slowly?

Personal, Social, and Emotional Development (PSED)

Focus activity: turn taking

Through playing turn taking games, the children will learn how to wait for their turn and start to talk about how we might feel when we don't get a turn.

Can you wait for your turn to roll the dice?

Mathematics

Focus activity: recap counting to 5

This week we will recap our previous learning, using 1:1 correspondence to count out 5 baubles on the Christmas tree.

Can you count out five baubles?



Expressive Arts and Design

Focus activity: making a christmas tree decoration

We will be making a christmas tree decoration from salt dough. The children will mix and roll the dough before decorating them.

How will you roll the dough ready for cutting?



Literacy

Focus activity: name writing in Christmas cards

We will look at different cards that people might send, and practise writing our names to sign our own Christmas cards.

How do you hold a pencil?
