

Communication and Language

Focus activity: Where would you see?

During this activity the children will need to listen attentively to match the picture card to the correct scene. They will be encouraged to reply in full sentences.

Understanding the World

Focus activity: Eid

The children will think about why Eid is a special time for Muslims and how it is celebrated across the faith.

Why is Eid a special time for Muslims?



Focus activity: grasping

Using control and a steady grasp, the children will use tweezers to move objects around.

Can you grasp the tweezers to collect the stars?

Focus activity: greetings

The children will use social stories to think about appropriate ways of greeting their friends and adults.

Mathematics

Focus activity: patterns



The children will create their own patterns, and develop their oracy skills by explain their patterns, then comparing the similarities and differences in other children's patterns.

Focus activity: shadow art

The children will explore light and dark, and the shadows that objects can create, using these to create their own shadow art.

Communication and Language

Focus activity: the lifecycle of a chick

Using key vocabulary such as *egg* and *hatch*, we will talk about the lifecycle of a chick, think about the sequence of events.

Understanding the World

Focus activity: investigating different types of seeds

We will be using magnifying glasses to guess what will grow from a variety of seeds.

What do you think will grow from the seed?

Personal, Social, and Emotional Development (PSED)

Focus activity: turn taking with new friends

Playing alongside our friends, we will try very hard to wait for our turn. We will try to include people we might not always play with in our game.

Who can you share your toy with?

Mathematics

Focus activity: comparing different amounts

We will carefully fill plant pots with seeds, and talk about which one has the most seeds.

Which plant pot has the most seeds?



Physical Development

Focus activity: climbing on the A-Frame

With support, we will try to travel safely over the climbing frame outside.

Can you pull yourself up and over the A-Frame?

Expressive Arts and Design

Focus activity: potato print flower

Inspired by our topic story, we will be using potatoes to print a flower.

How could we make a flower shape?

Literacy

Focus activity: letter formation

We will practice forming letters from our names throughout the week. We will try to hold our pencil appropriately and practice forming letters from the correct starting place.
