We are deeply saddened by the announcement from Buckingham Palace yesterday that Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has died. Our thoughts and prayers are with the Royal Family, the nation and commonwealth. During our collective worship today, we remembered and paid tribute to the Queen and held a minute of silence to pay our respects. We will continue to offer reassurance and answer the children's questions with honesty using age appropriate language. We will be in contact with you when we have further information regarding schools and plans for the day of the Queen's funeral. In the meantime, the children are expressing their thoughts and reflections about the Queen on a small postcard in school. We will be inviting staff and parents to express their condolences in a Memory Book which will be available to sign in the school's reception area during the day and playground at the end of the school day. Parents, you may like to consider taking your children to the Borough's Proclamation Ceremony. This event is the formal proclamation of the ascension of His Majesty King Charles III in the Borough and will be made by the Deputy Lord Lieutenant and the Mayor, from the balcony of Stratford Town Hall at 2p.m. on Sunday 11th September. This historic event will be the first in 70 years.



Early Years Foundation Stage

This week

We have said a big “Welcome!” to all of our new starters, and a big “Welcome back!” to all of our nursery children. The children have focused on getting to know each other, learning their classroom routines, and trying hard to follow their class rules. Using the book “The Colour Monster”, we have supported the children with understanding their feelings. Please speak to your child’s teacher if you have any concerns about your child’s transition.

We will continue to explore feelings and friendships, using the story “*Hello, Friend*”. We will also continue our work on the Christian Creation Story, and find out how Christians believe the world began.

Key Stage 1

This week

Children in Year 1 and 2 returned to school with enthusiasm and settled into their new classes quickly. We resumed all of our activities including P.E, music and Forest Schools. We also learned about our class names, ‘Hedgehogs’ and ‘Squirrels’, both woodland animals but did you know that hedgehogs like to hibernate between March and November, using leaves to make their winter bed and that squirrels can find food buried beneath 30cm of snow!
