A note from the Headteacher

This year is flying by and it is hard to believe we are in the last half term of the 2022-2023 academic year. I am incredibly proud of how hard the staff and children are working and hope to see the fruits of their efforts in end of term assessments which will inform our annual reports to parents. Please continue to support your children by encouraging them to learn at home - phonics and times tables and listening to them read every day - it really does make a difference.

Did you know?

Number on roll at WHCS = 310 children (it is interesting to note that male = 42%, female = 58%) Children with English as an additional language = 79% We value and celebrate the diversity of language across our school. This diversity is also reflected in the religion of our children with 40% Christian and 40% Muslim and 20% other religions or no-religion. We are highly inclusive and welcome all, embracing difference. Children with Special Educational Needs (SEND) = 18% (this is higher than National data - at state-funded primary schools (including academies) in January 2022, 13% of pupils were classed as having SEND). Attendance is 92% across the whole school. Pre-covid this would have been 96% so we are still looking to improve.

We are looking forward to our **Sports Day on the 22nd June**. Weather permitting, Early Years will hold their event in the morning at 9:15 am, KSI at 10:30 am and KS2 at 1:30 pm. We hope families can come and support their children. Please bring picnic blankets, shade and lots of drinks in case it is hot. We will be watching the weather very closely.

Key Stage 1

This week: In year 1, we have finished our Maths unit 'Place value within 50' and began our new unit, 'Counting in 2, 5 and 10's'. Year 2 are finishing off their 'Fractions' unit' by identifying unit and non unit fractions.

In English, both Year 1 and Year 2 children having been working extremely hard to complete their final piece of writing for 'The history of nursing' unit. Please ask your child to share their amazing diary entries at home. All of KS1 had the opportunity to hear about the wonderful work of the London Air Ambulance. We were given information about the jobs of the people who work for the charity, the type of plane, and uniforms they wear. 
