A huge well done to all the children who have been completing statutory assessments. Year 6 worked their socks off completing and editing pieces of writing to enable their teachers to assess whether they are working at the age related expectations for a year 6 child. A few children's work has been selected for us to present to the Local Authority as part of a moderation process. All teacher assessments and SATS results will be shared via the children's end of year annual reports. Year I and some Year 2 children completed their Phonics Screening Check last week and Year 4 are finalising the Multiplication Tables Check: we will

share results with you in the children's annual reports.

Year 6 will now be focussing on their end of term production of 'Matilda' working closely with Miss Kee, our drama teacher. All parents across the school are invited to attend. We have a matinee performance at 2pm (parents and children) and an evening performance at 6pm (adults and older siblings only) on the 12th July. Tickets will be available to order next week from the office.

We are looking forward to welcoming families to our **Sport's Day on Thursday this week** - the current weather forecast says light rain showers and a gentle breeze and we are hopeful to run the event in cooler weather. We will be having a cake bake in support of our charity, Save the Rhino, so please bring some change if you wish to buy cakes for your family.

Early Years Foundation Stage

This week:

This week in Reception the children have made inferences about the main character Jabari. To celebrate Fathers day we created our own robot cards. The children remembered and spoke about the 2D shapes they was using. It was lovely to see that every card was unique and they enjoyed talking about their robots. In maths we have been using a rekenrek tool for counting. Little Owls have been immersed in water play alongside making a handprint card for some one special. Little owls have enjoyed becoming construction workers participating in role-play and building. On Friday we celebrated pyjarama day and we made a splash at our own pool party. As the weather continues to be extremely hot, it is crucial the children do not wear many layers of clothing.

Key Stage 1

This week:

Sports Day for LKS2 will be on Thursday 22nd July 2023 at 1:30pm.





