A note from the Headteacher

Behaviour expectations

Visitors to our school always comment on the exceptional behaviour of the children at WHCS. This is especially evident as they tour the school visiting classrooms. Our teachers ensure children know they are expected to work hard in class, with a positive attitude to learning. We constantly refer to the school's vision and values, which the children know so well, to share our high expectations.

However, we recognise children are learning how to get along with each other and how to disagree well. Arguing and disagreeing are normal, as is feeling frustrated and angry. While most of our children are extremely well-behaved, polite and well-mannered all the time, a small number of children find it difficult to manage their emotions and this can result in poor behaviour choices.

It is true that since the pandemic, we have noticed children using swear words from a younger age, sometimes copying family members or words they have heard through screens. Some children resort to physical aggression when upset in the playground particularly when engaging in competitive ball sports. Thankfully, instances of bullying (repeated instances of seeking to harm, intimidate or coerce) are extremely rare. However, none of these behaviours are acceptable and we make this very clear. We also understand that children are affected by their circumstances - poor behaviour choices can be a result of adverse childhood experiences. We have a raft of mental health measures in school to help children. Our Relationship and Behaviour policy sets out our trauma informed approach to understanding and responding to children who need support to promote positive behaviour.

We use the Good to be green system in school to promote good behaviour choices. We believe that praise and support are more powerful than negativity and sanctions. However, sanctions are used to give children time-out to reflect on the impact of their behaviour on others. We also use the Zones of Regulation to help children recognise how they are feeling, teach self-regulation and emotional control. Please talk to your children about how they can deal with emotions and how swearing, hitting and picking on someone is never ok. Children must always seek the support of an adult in school rather than retaliate, even when they feel hurt and angry. We are trying to raise children who have an exceptional moral compass. They will make mistakes and our role is to help them learn from their mistakes.

Our Vision is to enable children, with God's guidance, to know and appreciate the wonder of God's creation, to live in harmony, embracing differences, to always act with compassion inspired by the example of Jesus, and to have the strength to follow their dreams and achieve their goals.

Early Years Foundation Stage

This week:

Little Owls have been showing compassion while giving our nursery dolls a good old wash. Key Stage 1

This week: This week in KS1, we have been working hard on our writing. We have been creating story maps about a special event that has either been passed down to us or we experienced. Please ask your child to orally tell you their story. In Year 2, we have began our new unit for Maths: 'Statistics': we have been investigating how to read and complete tally charts. In Year 1, we have moved onto fractions; we will looking at the whole and identifying halves. This week, we have also begun our three week art project: 'The Natural World'. We have been exploring natural habitats around the school by focusing on our senses.
